## LIVERPOOL, April 30—The new steamship "Laurentic," for the White Star Dominion service, sailed last evening from here for Montreal on her maiden trip. The Laurentic was built by Harland and Wolff, of Belfast, and launched on September 1st. Her sailing marks the entry of the White Star Line upon the Canadian trade in conjunction with the Dominion Line.

The new steamer "Meganitic" will also be engaged in the service making her first trip early in June.

The Laurentic is the largest vessel in the Canadian trade, being 565 feet long and measuring 15,000 tons. She is designed to carry a large quantity of cargo and a full complement of passengers, 200 1st class, 430 2nd class and 1,000 3rd class.

The Laurentic is the first passenger steamer fitted with combination reciprocating engines, with low pressure turbines.

## SCHOONER IS LOST

LUNenburg, N. S., April 30.—A telegram from Capt. Louis Walters of the schooner Addie and Beatrice reports the total loss of the vessel at Lunenburg in the Bahamas, while on a passage from Bermuda to Mobile. The captain's wife was with him; all hands were saved. The Addie and Beatrice was built at Shelburne in 1906, and was 199 tons.

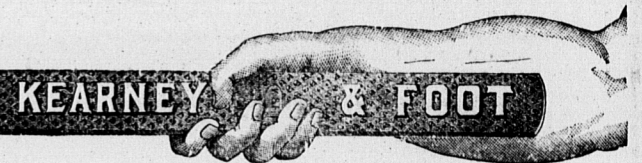
