AGREEMENT HAS BEEN REACHED WITH BESCO

TORONTO MAN WAS STRIPPED AND FLOGGED

(Canadian Press) TORONTO, Feb. 11.—Stanley Military Barracks, Toronto is shaken with a sensation arising out of the alleged brutal flogging of a Trooper J. Bowen, of the Royal Canadian Dragoons, by a number of his comrades, according to an article in the Star Weekly. Bowen was taken out of his room by his comrades, says the article, stripped partially of his clothing and flogged with whips until his back was a mass of welts, and he was rendered unconscious. Then, evidently to revive him, he was thrown into a snow bank, but this action falling in its purpose he was taken into the medical detention room of the barracks where he was resuscitated. It is stated that an unofficial and entirely illegal "barracks room court" met Feb. 20th.
