PRIZES FOR SCHOOL CHILDREN

Through the action of the Minister of Agriculture, The Honourable Martin Burrell, arrangements have been made to have the Canadian Bankers' Association co-operate with the Department of Agriculture in providing a liberal sum of money to be offered in prizes for calves and pigs exhibited by boys and girls under 17 years of age, at county or township fairs. These competitions are known as the "Canadian Bankers' competitions" and are linked up with the activities of the Live Stock Branch of the Dominion Department of Agriculture. They represent an effort to increase interest in live stock, and constitute a part of the active campaign for more and better stock inaugurated and carried on by The Honourable Mr. Burrell through his Department. The generous support accorded to the movement by the Canadian Bankers' Association, affords a practical demonstration of the attitude of the banks towards the live stock industry, and the active participation of the Association in this campaign is bound to strengthen and create general interest in farm live stock. Canadian Bankers' Competitions will be held at a large number of shows this year, and boys and girls should lose no time in finding out all about them. The calves and pigs must be fed at least six weeks by the boys and girls who exhibit them, so that it is very important to act promptly in securing a copy of the rules and other information. Full information regarding the competitions can be obtained from the manager of any branch bank in the locality where a fair is held.

Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole head of a family or any male over eighteen years of age, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Rules—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 20 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house is required except where residence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section along side his homestead. Price \$5.00 per acre. Duties—Six months residence in each of three years after earning homestead patent; also 30 acres extra cultivation. Pre-emption patent may be obtained as soon as homestead patent on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$10.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 30 acres and erect a house worth \$300. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W. CORY, C. M. MAY SHOW PEOPLE REAL WAR FARE

The interesting suggestion is made that exhibitions of food prepared so as to meet the demands of war economy shall be given a prominent place at the various fall fairs held throughout the country this year. In this way, it is held, thousands of Canadian women might receive suggestions as to the best way to do effective war service in their particular sphere. The farmer's wife seldom gets the credit due her for her war service, yet in official circles where estimates are made from time to time as to the reserve strength of the country, great confidence is placed on her efforts. The women of the rural districts are none the less helpful because they do their part without ostentation, far removed from the spotlight of the press. A demonstration of how food containing satisfying and strengthening substances can be prepared tastefully and cheaply would fill a great need of the times, and it is felt that many thousands of people could be reached and influenced at the fall fairs where the crowds are usually in a receptive mood. One woman's club is seriously considering the establishment of a lunchroom at the local fair in order to offer regular meals of "war food." SOLDIER'S LETTER TO A CHILD

The following letter from Pte. Frank Walker (one of the first Island boys to leave for the front) has been received by little Miss Marie Sullivan, the 11 year old daughter of Mrs. James Sullivan of Elmisdale. Miss Sullivan though young is doing more war-work than many adults, being a member of the Red Cross Society and the maker of two pairs of socks which have been sent to the soldiers overseas.

France, June 28th 1917 Dear Miss Marie:—Your very nice note, enclosed in a pair of socks, which came to me a few days ago, gave me a great deal of pleasure. Of course I appreciated the socks. I received a whole parcel of them from different people, through the Red Cross Society of Summerside, and I split them up among the boys. I hope they will answer and thank all the kind friends who sent them. But out of the bundle I kept your pair for myself so that I could answer your note, just because you were "A little girl from P.
