THE COOK'S CORNER

CHEESE FOR THE PARTY Particularly appropriate on the anniversary of National Cheese Week and the beginning of the fall and winter party-giving season...

CHEESE SQUARES Cut fruit bread in squares (about 1 1/2 inches). Blend together grated cheddar cheese with sufficient butter to make a soft mixture...

CHEESE MUFFIN 2 cups flour 3 teaspoons baking powder 1-2 teaspoon salt 1-2 cup grated cheese 2 tablespoons butter, melted 1 egg 1 cup milk

Mix and sift together flour, baking powder and salt. Add grated cheese. Mix in milk and beaten egg, then add butter. Fill tiny buttered muffin tins about one-third full of batter...

CHEESE SANDWICHES Cut bread three-quarters inch thick into small squares or rounds. Butter and pile with cream cheese mixed with salad dressing...

CHEESE SHORTBREAD 2 1/4 cups flour 1-2 teaspoon salt 1-2 cup butter 1 small bar cream cheese (yellow)

Sift together flour and salt. Cut in butter. Blend in soft cheese and work into a compact dough. Chill. Roll thin. Cut with cookie cutter. Bake in a moderate oven, 375 degrees F., from 5 to 10 minutes.

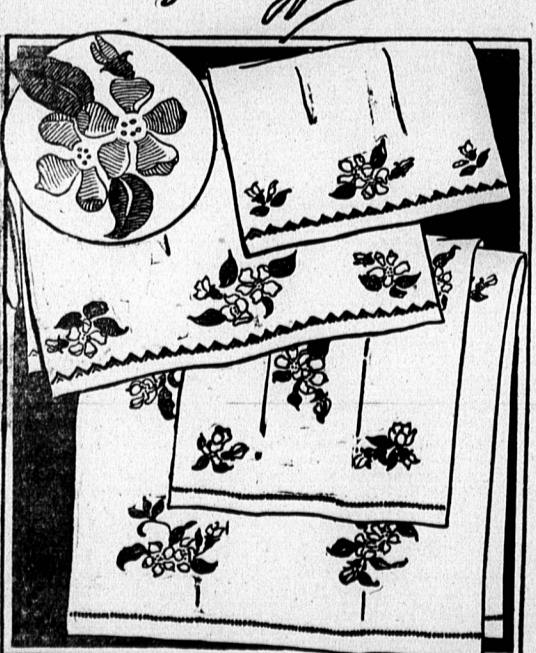
