

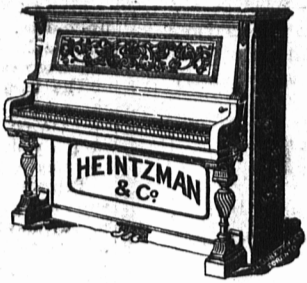

ARREARS OF TAXES

NOTICE TO DEFAULTERS

Notice is hereby given that the Act passed by the Legislature in 1927, to provide a more speedy and simple method for the collection of arrears of taxes, will be put into force at once for the collection of Arrears of 1929 and all previous years. The new Act does not require proceedings to be taken against the land, the advertising of the same, nor the filing of Final Notices to Defaulters; and it gives the Government the additional power, after the tax is one month over due, of suing in any Court, and of levying on all goods and chattes found on the premises in possession of the party sued. Where there are no goods and chattes, or not sufficient to levy on, proceedings will be taken against the land under the old Act as heretofore.

The new Act, as well as the old, declares all taxes to be "Crown debts," having priority over all other Claims, Judgments, Mortgages, Bills of Sale etc. All Taxes will be sued for in the name of the King.

Persons in Arrears for Land, Road or Income Tax are requested to make immediate payment to save expenses.

She sailed last night with 1000 bags of oats, potatoes and sundries. She had little difficulty with the ice from Charlottetown.

One of J. H. Myrick & Co's boats, at their Sea Cow Head factory, newly built, was taken out for a trial trip by foreman J. B. McCarthy, who, by the way is an old mariner, and in some unaccountable manner became capsize, and for a time Mr. McCarthy was in imminent danger, but was picked off by a relief crew, who were happily at hand, and the boat was towed ashore.

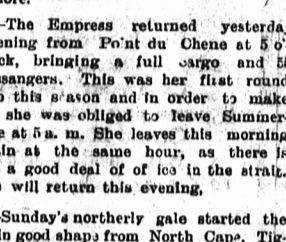
The Empress returned yesterday evening from Point du Chene at 5 o'clock, bringing a full cargo and 55 passengers. This was her first round trip this season and in order to make it, she was obliged to leave Summerside at 5 a. m. She leaves this morning again at the same hour, as there is yet a good deal of ice in the strait. She will return this evening.

Sunday's northerly gale started the ice in good shape from North Cape, Tignish and Kildare Cape. There were some lines run at Kildare Cape on Monday but as the ice was in sight of the eye some held back. The North Cape gear was run out with rapidity and packing will be in order in a very few days now. The season is nearly twenty days late and an extension should be granted to those packers on the North side who have been under such heavy expense during the past month.

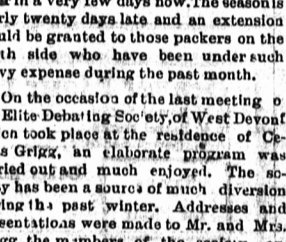

Tenders for the proposed waterworks and sewerage system of Summerside, were opened last night. As yet no definite information is available, as according to specification, tenders are in different forms, some for the whole system and some for part, and it will necessitate considerable work on the part of the commissioners to compare these in order to ascertain which will be the most advantageous to the town. Quite a number of tenders have been received. The Guardian understands that it is the intention of the commissioners as soon as possible to call a public meeting of citizens and submit the whole scheme for their consideration. In connection with this there are a number of contractors and manufacturers' agents in town, tendering for the proposed system and materials.

De the west side near Waterford, recently Capt. Melrose was in charge of a new boat, owned by Thomas Bullock, when she capsized among the blue bluffs, but another boat was out for a trial spin, owned by Patrick Fitzgerald, and he picked up the crew of three men who were with Capt. Melrose. A disaster was thus averted. This is a poor time for yacht racing around the coast of this Island.

Building operations in Summerside have been retarded considerably by the unfavorable weather. Yet quite a number of buildings are under construction. Messrs J. M. Clark & Co. have the following contracts well under way: T. C. P. Yea, residence Water Street; John Matheson residence Spring St. both finished outside; Vernon Matthews, residence Fitzroy St. cellar completed and foundation laid; Mrs. Dempsey, residence Church St. C. R. Rogers residence Central St. the Misses Mawley, residence Central St. just commenced. They also have the contract of the Christian Baptist Church to be built on the corner of Summer and Church St. The M. P. Selvarman & Co., have the following well under way: Mrs. L. Rain, residence Spring St. outside about completed; Lewis Taylor, residence Church St. cellar and foundation completed. They also have the contract of the building of the Baptist Church. These buildings, and others in contemplation, will when completed add greatly to the appearance of the town and will do much to remove the stain left by the fire of October last.

Phillip Gallant had the misfortune Tuesday morning of having his berringtons destroyed by the ice which was carried into the harbor with the tide. The loss at this season of the year is a heavy one as Mr. Gallant has for a number of years been dependent upon the fishing for a livelihood. In addition to this, his regular calling, he has acted as a sort of guardian angel to the harbor having rescued from drowning twenty three persons in all, the last of them only a few days ago. His services in this latter capacity have received recognition at the hands of the Dominion Government who on one occasion presented him with a pair of binocular glasses, suitably engraved. It would appear from a cursory view of the situation that a man who has done so much for his fellowmen, and Mr. Gallant has risked his life time and again for others, should not be forgotten while deeds of heroism are being rewarded. Doubtless he will receive his reward some day, but in the meantime his little family has to be maintained and a little substantial aid just now would count for very much more than an epitaph reading "he saved others."
