A BUGOUT OFFERTORY. A box has reached the Bible House in London from Bugout, British Solomon Islands, containing specimens of some of the items contributed by the natives to the collection made on Bible Sunday at the Melanesian Mission Church. The contents include some strings of beads, porpoise teeth, and armlets, which are recognised coin of the realm. One string of red beads, measuring the length of the arms at full stretch equals two shillings; four similar lengths of white beads are equal to one shilling; while each of the white rings for wearing on the arms are of the value of one shilling. Among the other articles—which are used for barter—are some pieces of tortoise-shell in the rough, a bamboo box such as is used to carry lime for betel chewing, a fine string bag, and a piece of the native cloth in which the Bugout women wrap their babies to keep them from the insects. Similar articles in the collection were sold in the nearest market and raised altogether £31 10, which has been duly remitted to the Bible House.

The following is from the Stoughton, Assa. Times of recent date: It is our sad duty this week to record the death of John Martin, late of Montague Bridge, P. E. I. who died very suddenly in the King Edward hotel, on Friday, the 23rd ult. Deceased was a son of Malcolm Martin, of Montague Bridge, P. E. I. and a brother of contractor Martin of Stoughton. He came to this town in April last and worked on the railroad until a few days ago, when he went to work with his brother, who has several contracts in town. He was in apparent good health until a few hours before his death. During the afternoon he became violently ill and his friends took care of him and did all that was possible to be done for him. He became unconscious and gradually sank. Medical aid was summoned, but nothing could be done to relieve him. His funeral was held on Sunday and was largely attended. Revs. McKenzie and Bagnall conducted the services at Robinson's undertaking rooms. The interment took place in Stoughton cemetery. Much sympathy is felt for his brother, who is so well and favorably known here, also for his wife and large family who mourn his loss in the distant East.

A By-law for allowing a rate of discount on the Assessments on Real Estate and Personal Property in the City of Charlottetown for general civic purposes for the current year ending the thirty-first day of December, A. D. 1905.
