DAN PATCH BREAKS TWO WORLD'S RECORDS

Remarkable Performances at Memphis Yesterday. The Pacing Wonder First Negotiates a Half in 56 Seconds, and Forty-five Minutes La es Goes the Full Mile to Wagon to 1571-4—Major Delmar Trots a Mile in 1.59 3-4.

MEMPHIS, Tenn., Oct. 27.—Dan Patch (1.56), within 45 minutes elapsed time this afternoon smashed two world's records in succession on the track of the Memphis Trotting Association.

First he went against the world's half-mile pacing record of 57½ seconds, held by Prince Alert, and clipped a second and a half from the record, negotiating the distance in 56 seconds flat. Next he hung out a new world's record for a mile pacing to wagon, making the mile in 1.57½, two seconds better than the time of 1.59½, which he made at the recent meeting of the Lexington (Ky) track, which stood as the world's record until this afternoon.

Major Delmar, E. E. Smathers' two minute trotter, was sent to lower his own record and he accomplished the feat. He cut a quarter of a second from the two-minute mark, making the mile in 1.59½.

The first quarter was made in 30 seconds; the half in one minute and the three quarters in 1.29½.

He was picked up, the forward sulky carrying the customary canvas dust strip. The three horses swept by the pole and McHenry gave the signal that the trial was a go. Starter Newton dropped the flag and the timers made ready to catch the new record for a half mile. The quarter was made in 28½ seconds and the pacer went under the wire with the hands of the timers' watches sharp on the mark of 56 seconds.

The afternoon's programme was the longest of the meeting. Besides two events for amateur drivers, five races were disposed of and the favorites were generally successful in fast time. The exception was the free-for-all pace, in which Daniel opened a prohibitive favorite. After winning the first heat the mare was beaten easily by Dan R.

MILE TO WAGON, 1.57 1-4.

Dan Patch came on the track to set a new wagon mark for the mile. The start was made with two runners as pacers. The quarter was made in 29½; the half in 58½ and the three-quarters in 1.28. Under the wire the champion pacer dashed in 1.57½, showing little effect from having smashed two records in a single afternoon. He was driven by McHenry in the wagon trial.

DOCTORS SHRINK FROM PUBLICITY

LONDON, Oct. 21.—A question of medical ethics has been brought before the public by a letter from the secretary of the British Medical Association respecting mention in the newspapers of the names of physicians in attendance upon distinguished invalids.

Some time ago a surgeon, whose name had thus been given in a paragraph in the leading London journals, wrote to the editor asking that in future his name be struck out from notes and inquiring as to the possibility of a general rule being adopted of omitting the names of medical men. The editor intimated that he would make such a rule if recommended by the medical profession. Thereupon the British Medical Association, which, its secretary points out, is the executive of a society including nineteen thousand members of the profession, took the matter up and passed the following resolution:—

That a circular letter be sent to the principal London newspapers, deprecating the mention in paragraphs relating to the illness of persons other than members of the royal family, or the names of the medical men in attendance.

None of the medical journals comment on this circular.

EARTH RIVAL TO MARCONI.

ROME, October 27.—A new system of wireless telegraphy, in which the earth is used for the transmission of waves, invented by Dario Campana, a young Italian, of Leghorn, was tried successfully at that city today. A company is being formed to exploit the system.
