Royal Oil Paintings Bequeathed To Queen Mary By Perth Man

LONDON, Feb. 13.—Douglas Edward Wrey, of Perth, whose estate has been probated at £160,000 and who claimed to be a descendant of the first Duke of Gloucester, left his royal oil paintings to the Queen, and falling her acceptance, to the present Duke of Gloucester.

The first Duke of Gloucester, to whom the will alludes, flourished about 550 years ago and was the son of Edward the Third. His title died with him. It was often revived later, notably by Richard the Third, who held it when he soliloquized about "the winter of our discontent" being made "glorious summer" and proceeded to snatch the Crown from his nephew.
