LONDON, June 28.—The Hebdomadal Council of Oxford University has decided to confer the degree of Doctor of Literature upon Dr. William Peterson, principal of McGill University. Principal Falconer of Toronto University, speaking in acknowledgement of the honorary degree of L.L.D. conferred upon him by Edinburgh University today, said that Canada had perhaps benefited more from Edinburgh's teaching than any other of the British Dominions. He urged that Edinburgh should offer Canadian graduates greater inducements for research and study and so prevent their going to the United States Universities which offered fellowships lavishly.
