 At the police court yesterday morning the adjourned case against George Essory, who was arrested on Saturday last charged with being drunk and disorderly was continued. Mr. Frank Morris of Morris & Smith, George Vissey, Richard Grant, John Conolly, and Councillor Brown gave evidence, after which Mr. Essory went on the stand and gave testimony on his own behalf. Mr. Frank Morris, witness for prosecution testified that Mr. Essory and two other men were in his doorway. They appeared to be talking and were obstructing the doorway. When he entered the door of his shop he nodded to the police to remove the people from his doorway. He had spoken to the police about the matter previous to entering store. Policeman Harper asked him to stand aside when Mr. Essory appeared to get angry. The other men moved away. On Monday following Mr. Essory visited his store and asked him if he was obstructing the entrance to his store. He told him he was. He (Morris) had to go around the crowd to effect an entrance and any person else would have to work their way in as he had done. He did not tell Mr. Essory to move away. Mr. Stewart, Counsel for defendant, contended that as Mr. Morris had not asked Mr. Essory to move, the police had no right to interfere. The other witnesses were for the defense, all of whom testified that they heard no bad language and that Essory was sober. During cross-examination Mr. Essory said that he might have had some liquor in Hewitt's bar. He did not remember having a misunderstanding with a man named McGregor during the day. The case was adjourned to enable the prosecution to procure further testimony. The larceny case was again before the court. After hearing the evidence of Annie Callaghan, a sister to the girl from whom the prisoner, Ella McNeill, says she purchased the tie, a further postponement till next Monday was made.
