S. S. LESSON. MARCH 21. JESUS CRUCIFIED AND BURIED. Luke 23. 25-53. Memory verses, 46, 47 GOLDEN TEXT. Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures.—1 Cor. 15. 3.

OUTLINE. 1. The Supernatural Darkness, v. 44, 45. 2. Our Lord's Death, v. 46, 49. 3. Our Lord's Burial, 50-53. Time.—Friday 7, A. D. 30. Place.—Golgotha.

LESSON HELPS. 44, 45. "The sun was darkened"—The sun's light failing, and so the Revised Version has it. "The veil of the temple" which divides the holy from the most holy place. The rent veil was an evidence that the end of the Jewish church was at hand.

46. "When Jesus had cried"—What he cried is recorded in Matt. 27. 46, and indicates the feeling of momentary doubt but not the fact that he was forsaken. The cry reveals the anguish of his soul.

47. "Centurion"—Leader of a hundred soldiers a captain. His testimony was similar to that of Pilate, and he saw in Jesus a righteous man.

48, 49. "Smoke their breasts"—An outward indication of grief. "Stood afar off"—There were friends of Jesus.

50, 51. "Joseph"—He was wise, for he was a counsellor; he was good and just and he was rich. He was a timid believer but now, as friendly to the government he claimed the body of the crucified one.

52, 53. "Begg'd the body"—Usual to allow the corpses of criminals to be given to relatives and friends for burial. A sepulchre—That is a vault cut out of the solid rock and the opening closed with a large stone.
