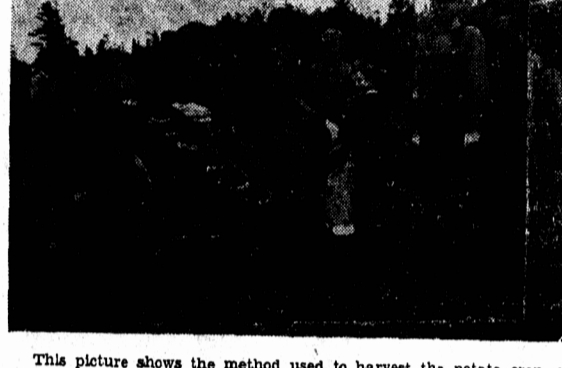

A tractor, driven by a 12 year old girl, draws an Elevator Digger, equipped with divided shovel, and operated by a youth of 17 summers. To the Digger is attached a Dahlman Potato Picker on which ride four men who attend to the removing of tops and etc., and the bagging of the potatoes. The machine is doing a very satisfactory job, at the rate of about one-half acre an hour.
