A British company, headed by the Messrs. Pearson of London, have 2,000 men at work rebuilding an old railway across the narrowest part of Mexico from Salina Cruz on the Pacific to Coahuacoalcos on the Gulf of Mexico. The distance is 192 miles and the work will be completed in less than three years. The design includes the equipment of a great harbor at each terminal, and special lines of steamers on both oceans. The route lies 800 miles north of the Nicaragua canal route, and much further still north of the Panama route, and it is claimed that with its equipment for carrying a large traffic could compete with either or both the canals if they were constructed. The enormous capital cost of either of the canals would involve the necessity of high tolls. The New York World speaks of the Pearson Company's railway project as "the British canal-flanking scheme."

Agents of both countries are working on the proposal that the United States shall acquire the Danish West India Islands. Denmark has found them unprofitable as colonies and it is thought would be willing to sell for \$4,000,000, which amount would probably be paid. The three islands in question, St. Croix, St. Thomas and St. John, have an area of 118,000 square miles and a population of only 32,000.

Tanton presided at the organ and beautifully rendered Mendessohn's Wedding March of Lohengrin, and a Bridal March by De Kovenos. The couple containing the bridal party was drawn by a pair of matched greys and the friends were driven to lunch in a coach drawn by two sorrels supplied by Robins' Livery. That U. S. Can Have No Colonies.

ACTION OF COLONIES

Required—No Tariff Allowed—Seven Bodies Found on Lake Wreck.

IMPORTANT JUDICIAL DECISION

WASHINGTON May 27.—(Special)—The Supreme Court of the United States is reported to have agreed that the constitution follows the flag; that the United States may have no subject colonies and that Porto Rico and the Philippines are war territory until Congress shall act and that it alone can incorporate new territory.

EFFECT OF THE DECISION. Intense interest centres in the decision from a business standpoint as well as a political one, inasmuch as whenever Congress acts to establish civil government instead of military rule now existing the products and merchandise of the Philippines and Porto Rico respectively must be admitted free of duty into the United States and vice versa.
