South's one-notrump bid was, of course, almost a psychic, designed to keep the opponents quiet, but had little if any value in that respect. As for the "standing" of three notrump doubled — having already dug a pit for himself, South might have tried an escape to four clubs, and then North could have protected himself at four diamonds. West led the spade ten, and South, jumping to the conclusion that this was the "top of nothing," put in dummy's queen so that when the trick lost to East, South himself might be able to collect several spade tricks. Unfortunately for this notion, the spade queen held, and from that point on, South was in the deepest quicksand. He led a low diamond from dummy. West took South's ten with the king and shifted to the heart deuce. East captured dummy's king and returned a spade. West forced the ace, and now, on the wild hope of dropping the diamond queen declarer laid down the ace. When the queen did not fall, he exited from dummy by leading the rich king. East won, cashed the diamond queen while West discarded a club, then cashed the heart queen and led the heart eight. West took the trick, and cashed the spade king. East threw off the high heart on this trick, and when West de-clarer was squeezed! He could not take another trick to add to his more three tricks, and so the penalty, even non-vulnerable, was 1100!

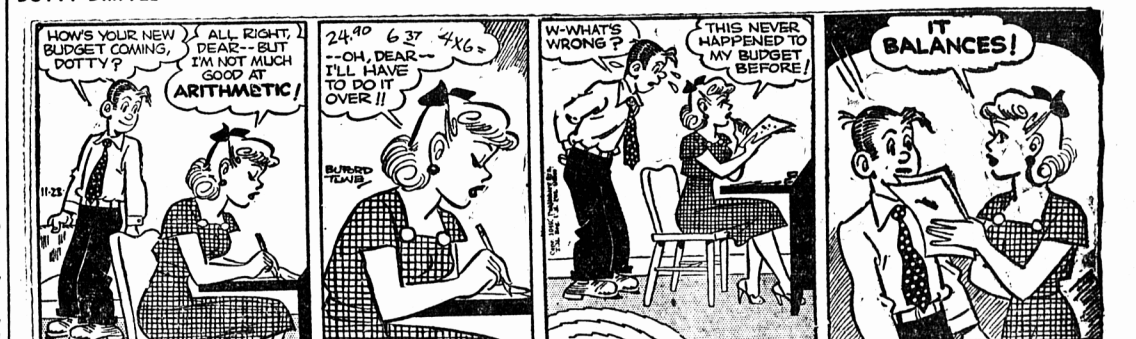

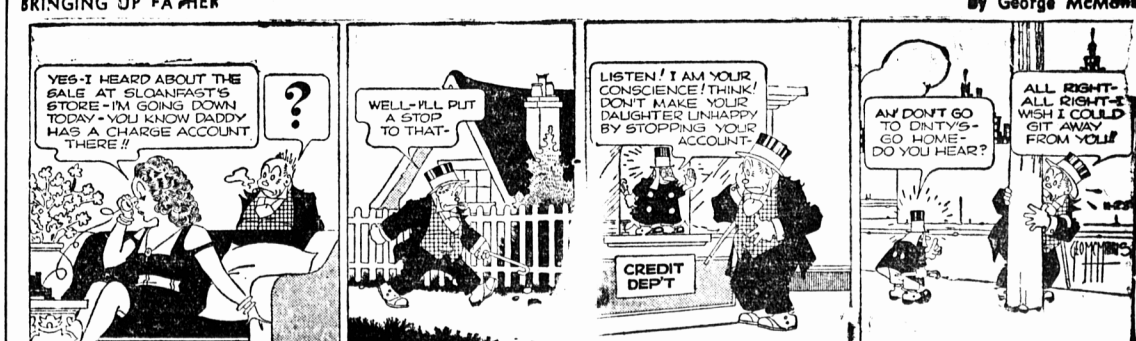

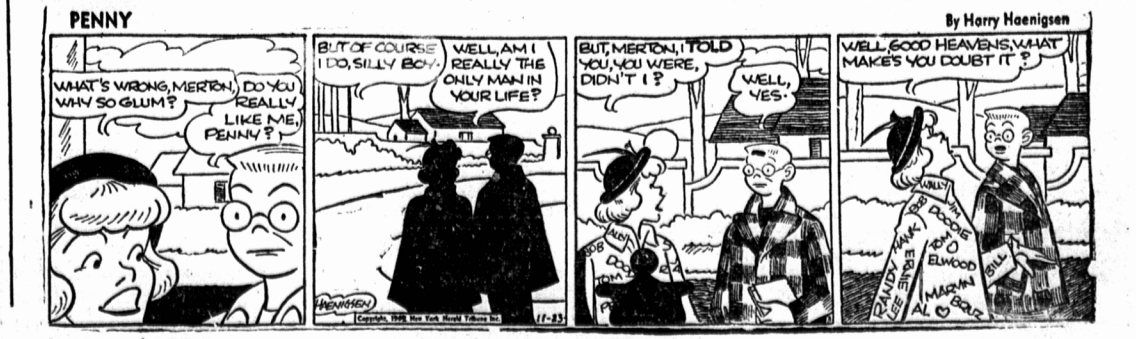
