Synopsis of Canadian North-west Land Regulations.

ANY person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or sub-Agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made in any Agency on certain conditions, by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister of intending homesteader.

Homesteads are made on the basis of residence on the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within the miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres solely owned and occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister. In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section on any side his homestead. Price \$10 per acre. Duties must reside six months in each of three years from date of homestead entry (including the time required to earn homestead patent) and cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$500.00.
