Classes in English, Geography, History, etc. were heard, after which the scholars work in muscular movement writing introduced during the year, map drawing and composition were shown to the parents. After the classes had been heard the following program was rendered.—Address of Welcome by Willie Connells. Exercise—"What I like to

do" by six children. Recitation—Dolly's speech, by Ella Ramsay. Exercise—The New Moon, by four little tots. Recitation—Whistling in Heaven, Allison Proffitt. Motion Exercise—In the morning, by eight boys and girls. Recitation—Somebody's Mother, Russell McLeod. Recitation—When the teacher gets cross, by Willie E. Connells. At the close of this program a flag drill was given by sixteen children and at the close under an arch of Union Jacks the recitation, "The British Flag was given by Ella Ramsay. The pupils and visitors were then treated to candy by the teacher, after which the following prizes were awarded. Prize for Attendance won by Russell McLeod. Prize for improvement in writing, Stacy Bryanton. Prize for English and Composition, Allison Proffitt. The three best compositions written during the year were then read—My Favorite Nook, by Marion Ramsay; The School Year of 1912-13, by Allison Proffitt; Country and City Life, by Samuel Proffitt. After expressions of satisfaction from the parents on the condition of the work, and improvement of the school room (the last named being done by the scholars from the proceeds of a school concert held last winter), the visitors and scholars proceeded to the school grounds where the Physical Exercise class was ably managed by Mr. Drake. This school is promised a prize for this work during the recent school year. A vote of thanks was each tendered to the residing and visiting teachers, and the visitors and scholars dispersed to their homes.
