WINNIPEG, Man., Nov. 2.—Smuggling dutiable goods from the United States into Manitoba is no longer a profitable nor attractive occupation, states A. Code, customs inspector for the district of Manitoba, who recently returned from a visit to the customs station along the international border. Within the past two months the customs force at the boundary has been materially strengthened. Approximately 200 secret service men have been recruited by the federal authorities to assist in combating smuggling. A number of them have been assigned to other prairie province patrols.
