THE COOK'S CORNER

HONEY PUMPKIN PIE

2 eggs, 1 cup milk, 1-2 cup cream, 1-2 cups pumpkin, 1-2 cup honey, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 1-2 teaspoon ginger. Method: Cut the pumpkin, remove the seeds and strings, and peel it. Cut in pieces and cook in water to cover until soft. Drain thoroughly and mash it, then press through a sieve to remove any lumps.

CRANBERRY VITA RELISH

Four cups cranberries, 2 apples, pared and cored, 2 oranges, 1 lemon, 1 cup sugar, 1 cup corn syrup, dark or white (or use 1 cup maple syrup or 1-2 cup honey). Put cranberries and apples through food chopper. Quarter whole oranges and lemons, remove seeds and put through chopper. Add sugar and syrup and blend. Chill in refrigerator a few hours before serving. Makes 1-2 quart relish. This sauce will keep well in the refrigerator for several weeks.

CRANBERRY JELLY

Two pounds (2 quarts) ripe cranberries, 4 cups water, 5 1/2 cups granulated sugar, 1-2 cup commercial pectin. Put water and cranberries in a large saucepan and bring to the boiling point. Cover and simmer ten minutes. Rub through a strainer. There should be 7 1/2 cups pulp and juice. Add water if necessary. Combine sugar and fruit and bring quickly to the boiling point, stirring constantly. The mixture must boil hard. Begin to count the time when hard boiling begins and boil hard, stirring constantly, for one minute. Remove from fire and stir in pectin. Stir and pour at once into sterilized glasses.

Price Control Questions And Answers

Questions and answers on Price Control will appear in The Guardian as a regular feature each day. The questions are those which have reached the Wartime Prices and Trade Board from housewives in this region. The answers are provided by the Board. Readers who have intelligent questions to ask on price control are invited to send them in writing to the Women's Regional Advisory Committee of the Wartime Prices and Trade Board, Chappell Building, Charlottetown.

Q. Are horse-drawn vehicles subject to the retail delivery orders? A. Yes. Only one delivery a day is permitted.

Q. Why is it unpatriotic to wear a matching hat and dress? A. Because to make a matching hat for your dress, you have to buy about three-quarters of a yard more dress material. This extra material can be saved if a basic felt hat is worn with several dresses.

Q. Does the new regulation regarding the 35-mile limit on commercial vehicles apply to hearses? A. Hearses are exempt from this regulation as long as they are on official business.

Q. I often find it difficult to buy tapioca now. Can you tell me if sago is almost the same thing? A. Sago is the same product as tapioca except that its kernels are smaller. Both sago and tapioca sell for about the same price.

Q. I hear the price of butter has been increased. Can you tell me how much more I should pay now? A. An increase of 10 in the price of butter was allowed on November 2. Your retailer can add one cent to 10 price he charged in the basic period.
