DIES OF WOUNDS. - Mr. and Mrs. James Sherry have been officially notified that their son, Gnr. Maurice Reginald Sherry, has died of wounds which he received on August 4th, the day previous to his death. Gnr. Sherry was, prior to his enlistment, an employee of Moore and MacLeod's. He took his preliminary military training at Beach Grove, was transferred to Dartmouth, and from there went overseas in September, 1943. He was in his twentieth year.

CROP REPORT. - Bank of Montreal Crop Report says: Recent rains have stimulated growth of grain crops, which are heading out satisfactorily. Harvesting of a below-average hay crop is proceeding in New Brunswick and Nova Scotia; in Prince Edward Island a heavy crop is being stored. Pasturage on the mainland is in fair to poor condition only. Potatoes have made good progress and are in full bloom; an average crop of early potatoes is indicated. Other roots are progressing favourably. Apples continue to size well and prospects for an average crop of good quality are favourable. Small fruits are below average. Additional rain is urgently required in many districts.
