An excellent "Animated Weekly," giving the news of the world, and a splendid comedy "Love, Luck and Candy," completed the bill.

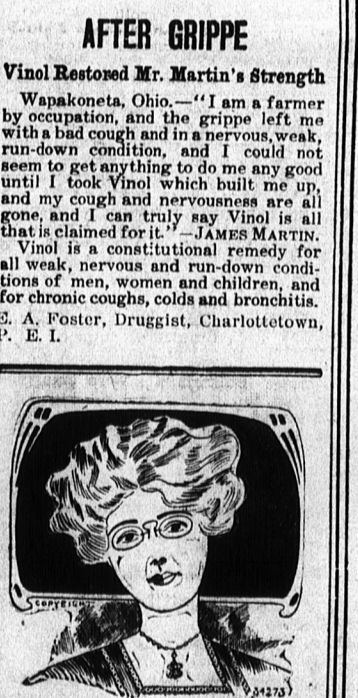
