REPORT OF THE P. E. I., S. S. ASSOCIATION EXECUTIVE.

Mr. President and Fellow Workers: In presenting to you our annual report we desire to express anew our gratitude to our Father in Heaven for the many evidences of his favor during the past year. We have cause to feel encouraged at the interest manifested in the work in our province.

During the year we were called upon to part with our Field Secretary, the Rev. G. P. Raymond, and we desire to express here our appreciation of his work and our regret at losing him. Mr. Raymond was indefatigable in his efforts. He was constantly in the field and ready to do all in his power to meet the demands made upon his time. To his earnestness and perseverance is due in a large measure our present excellent organization and success of the work. After his resignation your committee appointed the Rev. A. D. Archibald to succeed him, and Mr. Archibald has been at work since the first of May.

The Field.—The organization of our work remains practically the same as last year. There are fifteen organized districts in our province. Each district has held one or more conventions during the year, the Field Secretary being present at each. The weather last winter was unusually severe, and this hindered the work somewhat. Some time was lost in the spring owing to the change occasioned by Mr. Raymond giving up the work. But notwithstanding these drawbacks the work has prospered and the outlook is encouraging. The purpose of our work is being better understood in many quarters and the relations between the District and Provincial Associations are growing more cordial. The work is opening up more clearly and we are now at a stage where we can make the most effective use of past organizations for carrying out new plans.

Institutes.—Hitherto it has been the plan to hold two Conventions in each district during the year. It is our aim to hold Institutes in place of some of the Conventions. A Convention is for inspiration, an Institute is for education and practical training as well; instruction is given in teaching methods; Sunday School lessons are taught and discussed; and the best modern methods of the Sunday School work are presented. We want to make the work of the Association tell in each school and the way to do this is to train all teachers. Already two Institutes have been held and reports show that they have been very profitable. We are glad to know that other districts are planning to make use of the Institute feature. We desire to urge this matter upon the attention of all Sunday School workers, for we feel that in this way the work will prove most helpful. As the nature of Institute work is better understood we are confident that interest in it will increase because of its helpfulness. Our Field Secretary after finishing his theological course devoted two years to the study of this line of work, at the Hartford School of Religious Pedagogy. He paid special attention to Psychology, Child Nature, and Teaching, and is well qualified to carry on this work. From what we have seen of his labors, and from reports coming in from various parts of the field we know him to be a skillful teacher. During the summer he has had an opportunity of becoming acquainted with the nature of the work needed in this Province, and he is now in a position to suit his experience to the needs of our schools. We feel that our teachers have rare opportunity and we hope to see them make use of it. Each district should plan to hold several Institutes during the year. We recommend the reappointment of Mr. Archibald as Field Secretary for the ensuing year.

Normal Work.—This is a very important department of our work and deserves the hearty co-operation of all our teachers. While the number of graduate

is not as large this year as last we believe there are reasons for it. The continued storms and severe weather last winter had much to do in preventing classes from meeting. But we hope for renewed interest in it this winter.

Primary Department and Cradle Roll.—We regret the loss of our Superintendent of this department, Miss Connors recently removed from the province, and we have no report of what has been done during the year. The Cradle Roll has been growing in favor and a number of schools have adopted it. We are very glad to have with us at this convention Mrs. Mary Foster Bryner, our International Field worker, and we are confident her visit will be of great benefit to all (our primary teachers in particular).

Grading and Supplemental Lessons.—There is much need for this part of our

work. It has been successfully tried in a number of our schools and has proved satisfactory. It gives definite, systematic work to the scholars, and it is a most satisfactory basis for grading the school. The course of lessons can be adapted to all schools, large or small, in the country or in the towns. We hope to see more of our schools adopt the course of lessons and conduct the examinations in the regular way.

Home Department.—(This feature of our work is designed to meet the needs of those who for any reason cannot attend the regular session of the school.) There are several Home Departments in a very flourishing condition, and it needs only some energy to have many more. Where it is utterly impossible to have a Sunday School open during the winter, we urge the Superintendent and Teacher to conduct it as a Home Department.
