GIANT SELECTED AS EXECUTIONER

COPENHAGEN, Sept. 27.—A giant by the name of Christensen, who used to be a policeman of the city of Slagelse, has been selected from 188 applicants for the post of public executioner to the government of Denmark.

It is more than twenty years since the last execution took place in Denmark, owing to the refusal of the late King Christian IX to sign a death warrant. The reason for the change is that there have recently been a number of murders of a particularly atrocious character. Christensen will combine with his duties as an executioner that of flogging. The Danish Parliament last year passed a law providing for the flogging of hooligans. It has yet to be seen whether the judges intend to make use of the law, which was strongly opposed.

TAFT AROUSES MODERATES' IRE

United States Fiercely Denounced For Partiality Toward the Rebels—Agree to Negotiate After Explosion of Wrath Moderates Agree to Negotiate Peace Terms with the Rebels.

HAVANA, Sept. 28.—A meeting of the Moderator National Assembly was hastily called yesterday to decide whether some way could be devised to settle the present difficulty without American intervention. These present included Vice-President Monpezat Capote and nearly all the members of the Cabinet and Congress. The pent-up indignation against the American peace commission straightway broke forth. Several men loudly condemned Secretary Taft and assistant Secretary Bacon, who were declared to have shown partiality in backing the rebels. The speakers shouted denunciations of the American Government and hotly insisted that the Moderator party should appeal to the powers of the world for protection.

It was declared that the government forces should fight to the death rather than submit to the terms insisted on by the rebels, and one speaker depicted the horrors of negro domination, which would result, he said, from the threatened Liberal ascendancy, brought about with the assistance of the United States. Some of the most radical asserted that the government had plenty of dynamite in Havana, which could be used to precipitate those international complications that accrue from the destruction of foreign property.

When this frenzy subsided, the meeting settled down to a consideration of reopening the negotiations. It was thought that the cardinal condition of the reopening of the negotiations should be that the Moderates insist that the commissioners require the rebels to lay down their arms before proceeding to further negotiate.

insistence on this condition, adding that if the proposition was not acceptable to them, the government forces would refuse to lay down their arms or deliver them, either to the rebels or the commissioners.

In the meanwhile Senator Dolz proposed that both sides appoint committees of six to treat for peace, but with the prior condition that the rebels lay down their arms. Secretary Taft approved of this. After hearing the views of Secretary Taft the assistant notified Mr. Taft that he would appoint a committee of six to meet a similar committee from the Liberals, leaving all points of difference to the arbitration of the commissioners. It was agreed that at the session of Congress on Friday the resignation of President Palma would be tabled pending negotiations. It was the ultimatum issued by Messrs. Taft and Bacon that brought the Moderates to agree to these conciliatory methods.

Secretary Taft said: I feel certain that a settlement is possible only along the lines suggested by us. We informed both the Moderates and the Liberals that unless they were willing to listen to reason the United States must enforce a settlement. I told them that a proclamation would be issued establishing a military government in the island, but that this would continue only so long as necessary to restore order and insure the holding of new and fair general elections. I made it plain that this mediatory government would surrender the conduct of affairs to the person fairly elected as soon as they could fairly establish themselves.

"Whatever the outcome of the negotiations, it is felt here that there will be need for all the American marines in reach, as there is little confidence in the Liberal leaders' ability to control their men. Secretary Taft declared that if necessary landings would be made not only at Havana and Cienfuegos, but at other points.

PALMA'S LETTER TO TAFT.

The following is the text of President Palma's letter of yesterday to American Peace Commissioners Secretary Taft and Assistant Secretary of State Bacon, announcing that he intends to resign the presidency, and refusing the peace terms offered him:

"Honorable Sirs,—I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your note of yesterday, the 24th, in which you express in a general way your opinions and points of view, according to your personal investigation of the cause of the present rebellion in Cuba, its state and the means to finish it in order to re-establish peace and order in the country.

"I could raise some objections and prove them to the estimate of the numbers of the armed insurgents and the sympathy to which you consider them entitled. But it is useless now to enter upon a discussion of this kind in view of the course you have adopted, and your resolution to make peace by all means.

"It is therefore my only purpose in courteously replying to your note, to repeat here in brief what I expressed in the conference you kindly had with me last night, namely, that I consider the conditions you understand to be necessary for the rebels to lay down their arms contrary to my personal dignity and the prestige of the government over which I preside, and accordingly, have taken the irrevocable decision to present to Congress my resignation of the office to which I was appointed by the will of the Cuban people at the last parliamentary elections."
