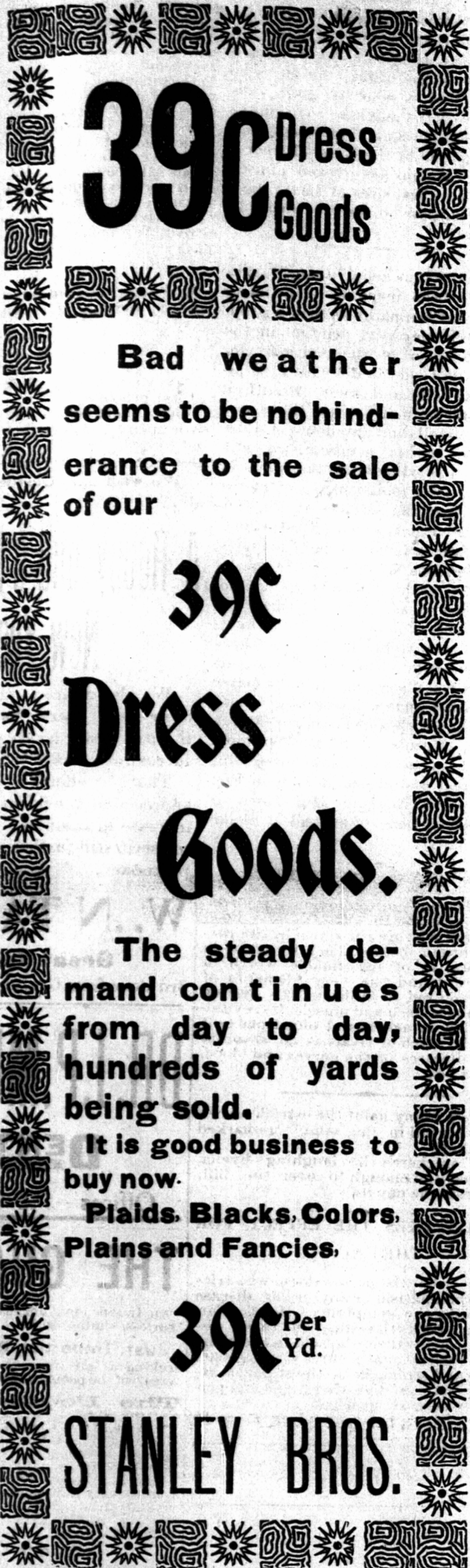

THE widow of Grant Allen, the Canadian novelist, intends to open a book shop in London. This seems a particularly suitable business for the wife of a distinguished bookman, and much interest has been evinced by literary London in Mrs. Allen's undertaking.

**The Red Cross Society, Canadian Branch.**

THE GUARDIAN has received from the Secretary of the Canadian Branch of the British Red Cross Society the first financial statement of that body since the outbreak of the war in South Africa. It is to be observed that the fund of this society has nothing to do with the Patriotic Fund at present claiming so much attention. The Red Cross Society renders aid to the sick and wounded soldiers in South Africa and it is estimated that this work of mercy has especial claims upon the Canadian public in view of the fact that nearly 2,500 Canadians have been sent to fight for the Queen and Empire in the terrible war now going on.

The Red Cross is an international society with branches or committees in every civilized country, working for the common good of humanity under the Geneva Convention. Colonies may not form independent societies. They must be branches of the National Society of the Mother Country. The nominal headquarters of the Red Cross are at Geneva, Switzerland. The society owes its existence to the labors of one philanthropic man, Henry Dunant. It has rendered invaluable service in all recent wars, and the sick and wounded on scores of battlefields and in military hospitals have reason to bless the name of its humanitarian founder.

Of the Central British Red Cross Committee H. R. H. the Princess of Wales is the Honorary President. The Canadian Branch was formed in 1897 and has for its Patron Lord Minto. The Honorary President is Hon. Dr. Borden, Minister of Militia and the President Hon J. M. Gibson. There is a Vice President for each Province, Sir Louis H. Davies being the representative of P. E. Island in that capacity. The Chairman of the Executive is Lieut. Col. G. S. Ryerson, M. D. who has gone to the front as the representative of the Canadian Branch at the seat of war.

The first appeal for funds in aid of this work was made October 15th and since that date down to 6th February over 18,000 dollars had been subscribed. It will be observed that the mission of the Red Cross is to minister to sick and wounded soldiers, while the Patriotic Fund is devoted to the widows, orphans or those dependent upon the soldiers of the Queen. Both are most deserving objects, but it has sometimes happened that persons desiring to contribute have failed to distinguish between them.

**Buller's Library.**

APROPOS of Sir Redvers Buller, he is that anomalous person, a scholar-soldier. Lord Wolseley, as is well known, cares for books, and writes on matters which concern his profession, remarkably well. So, for that matter, did U. S. General Grant, so did both Sherman and Sheridan. For a military man to write with vigor and elegance is by no means uncommon. But General Buller, apart from all this, is a bibliophile, a bookman, a hunter of libraries. He never starts on a campaign without a volume of Charles Lamb's essays and one of Bacon's as well. He possesses, at his country home, an excellent library, and loves to handle, to re-arrange, and hence to fondle, all its contents with his own hands. In other words, he is a literary fighter, one of the rarest combinations known among those many with which the records of human nature furnish us. Our own Captain King, (now a general, I believe, since his services in the Philippines) is the author of many successful novels. But though General Buller does not write novels, he reads them, and by no means omnivorously, preferring always the best, of whatever style and trend.
