**MASSAGE AND EYE EXERCISES.**

Sometimes you may notice that the crystals of the eyes look clouded, or that muscles about the eyes twitch. **NATIONAL PARK FOR SCOTLAND**

The movement for the acquisition of a public park on the banks of Loch Lomond has at last taken a definite shape. Sir John Stirling Maxwell, Bart., and Alexander Wylie, of Cordale, have secured an option on the estate of Balloch, and they have suggested that if the Corporation of Glasgow will contribute £10,000 (\$50,000) toward the purchase price of £30,000 (\$150,000), the remainder could be raised by public subscription and by co-operation of other public bodies.

This was the largest estate ever put through the Surrogate Court here. It totalled \$1,535,250.


**ST. CHARLES TEA**
