

Standard Oil Company.

A dividend has just been declared which makes the holders of shares feel that it is "good to be there." The dividend is \$2 a share, and it is paid so far this year. Last year's dividends, aggregated \$100,000,000, were paid in the form of a bonus to the shareholders. Here the oil just loads itself into the steamers, and is carried to Chicago and the West. Several shorter pipe lines than these are in use, and the oil is shipped in various other directions.
The claim is made that it is this wonderful reduction in freight, though having the oil run by itself, that makes the Standard Oil Company such a handsome paying institution, and enables it to kill its competition. They have neglected to give their customers the profit that they can earn by their tubes, and charge pretty nearly what it would cost if the oil were carried by ordinary means of transportation, with a profit added.
