POLICE COURT.—At the Police
court yesterday morning the follow-
ing cases were dealt with: One
breach of the Prohibition Act, ad-
judged till the 20th inst.; one pro-
hibition case (selling essences
without keeping record) fined \$20
or 30 days; another similar case,
dismissed; one breach of the milk
by-law, adjudged till Monday; an-
other similar case (selling milk
without license) fined \$1 or five
days; a third milk by-law infringem-
ent case (milk being below 3 1/2
per cent butter fat) fined \$10 or
20 days; one man charged with
corner loading fined \$5 or 30 days;
one joy rider fined \$25 or 30 days
for overspeeding and an additional
\$25 or 30 days for operating a motor
vehicle under the influence of
liquor. One of the young men who
narrowly escaped death when the
car he was driving crashed into the
outgoing train on Longworth Ave-
nue was dismissed for speeding on
that occasion.
