Since that time the population of the Republic has more than doubled and the number of African descent has increased from four millions to seven and a half millions.

Mr. Smart, Deputy Minister of the Interior, makes a good report in regard to Northwest immigration. Last year some effort was made to induce immigration from the western States of the Republic and about 7,000 of the same valuable class have come in, with a good deal of farm stock and money.
