ENO'S FRUIT SALT

Asked To Form New Cabinet

ANKARA, Turkey, Sept. 9.—(AP)—Premier Recep Peker resigned today and Foreign Minister Hasan Saka—who recently helped complete arrangements whereby the United States will spend \$100,000,000 for military aid to Turkey—was instructed to form a new cabinet.

Peker's government fell under the impact of growing criticism of his domestic policies which were held by many in his own peoples party to have been autocratic.

Only three days ago Peker shook his year-old cabinet in an effort to combat dissatisfaction, and today's announcement came as a surprise.

Saka's government will be in interim cabinet to serve until the National Assembly reconvenes a November.

VIRUS WARFARE TO FIGHT PESTS IN TIMBERLAND

VICTORIA, Sept. 10.—(CP)—Large-scale bacterial warfare is in store for insect destroyers which save cost Canada millions of dollars in ruined timber.

Dr. J. J. deGryse, head of the Dominion government forest insect investigation branch, visiting here, said plans to fight forest enemies—"loopers" budworms and sawflies—are well advanced.

The agents to be used are virus diseases, bacteria, fungi and protozoa, but chiefly viruses.

"All these agents we will use to fight forest pests are absolutely harmless to human or animal life," said Dr. deGryse. "Virus is going to be our important means of warfare because it is subject to artificial manipulation and can be increased in virulence.

"We can even train one that normally feeds on one particular host to attack another altogether. It is just a question of finding methods. The hemlock looper infestation has not altogether disappeared here, but it is on the way out. There's nothing to worry about any more.

"If we had had the means of combating the 'looper' with virus disease at the very beginning, much damage could have been forestalled.

"Our idea is to assist nature. In our laboratory we will propagate these diseases artificially, and keep the virus in stock for future emergencies. To our knowledge this will be the first venture in the world in mass production of viruses."

Planning centre for the new war will be a laboratory now being built at Sault Ste. Marie, Ont.—a very elaborate and complicated institution where scientists will work with organisms invisible to the highest-powered microscope and able to pass through the finest filters.

Chicago Auditorium For New College

CHICAGO, Sept. 10.—(AP)—If a Roosevelt College student is scolded for dozing in a classroom this fall, he can say: "Well, William Howard Taft, Christy Mathewson, Arthur Conan Doyle and Buffalo Bill slept here."

The heavy-eyed scholars will be stating facts.

The college is preparing to move into the old Auditorium Hotel and theatre building at Michigan Ave. and Congress St.

The massive 58-year-old structure—10 storeys of granite, limestone and brick solidly surmounted by an 80-foot tower—is as noted for its architecture as for the parades of personages who trod the mosaic floors.

Frank Lloyd Wright once commented: "The building became famous before it was completed." While the ornate beauty of the general interior made eyes bulge out, the theatre literally grabbed citizens by the ears. Chauncey M. Depew, competent judge of the sound of his own and other voices, termed the acoustics unrivalled.

At the formal dedication in 1889, Adeline Patit sang two verses of "Home Sweet Home" at \$2.100 per verse.

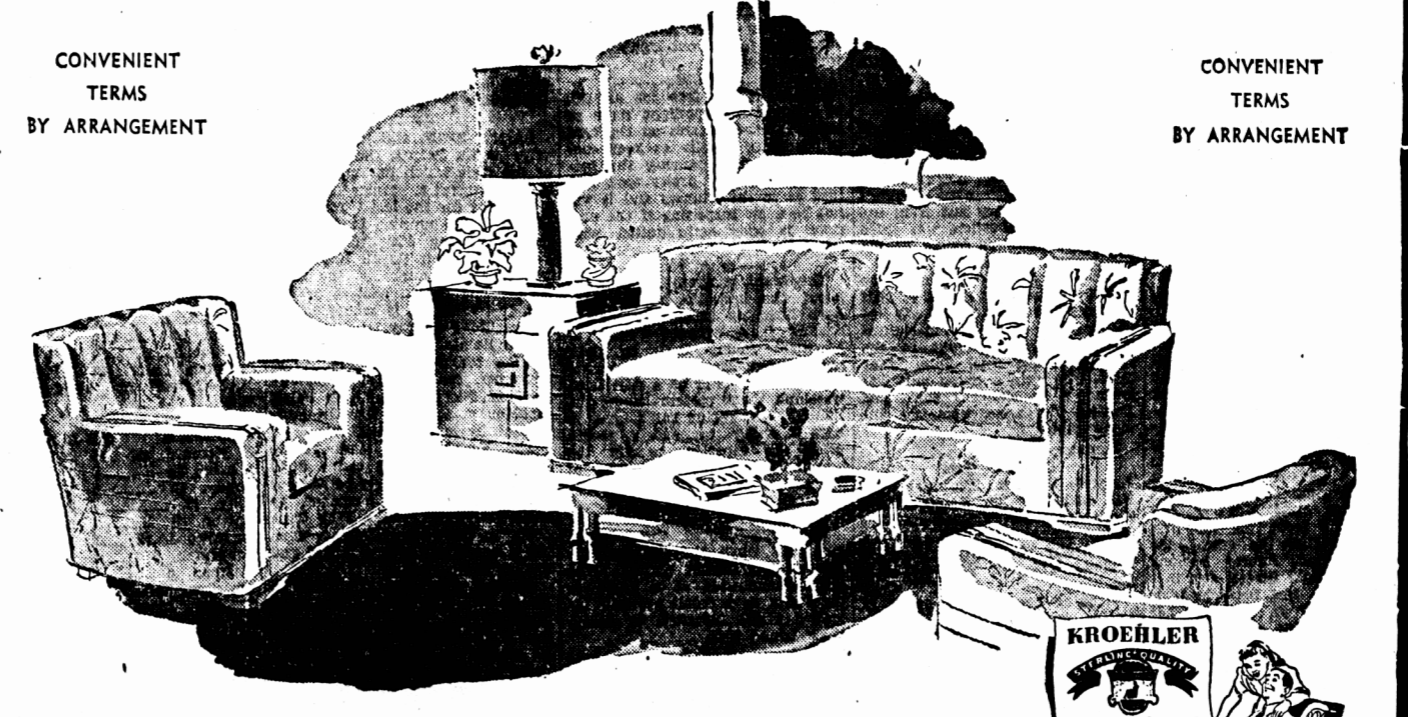
