One of our leading merchants has, it is understood, consented to adopt, after July 1st, the six o'clock closing system. It is currently rumored that some other influential business men are taking opposition to the move to have this system made general. Why there should be any objection to the system seems hard to understand. It has often been argued that clerks can under the 6 o'clock system do all the work that is to be done; and experience teaches that long hours only tend to make the employe dull and discontented. In Summerside it is a well known fact that the stores are busiest between four and six o'clock, and under the present system half or more of the clerks are then at supper, while if all would remain at their posts until six o'clock the trade would be much easier handled and all would have the satisfaction of knowing that their day's work was over with the supper hour, and the evening left for recreation which serves to fit them for the next day's duties. As it is, those who go to supper at six o'clock only get back in time to close up, and their services count for nothing after they leave at six. The duller hours between six and closing time, and there is practically nothing gained by remaining open until seven. Summerside might just as well follow the most progressive towns and close its stores at six p. m.

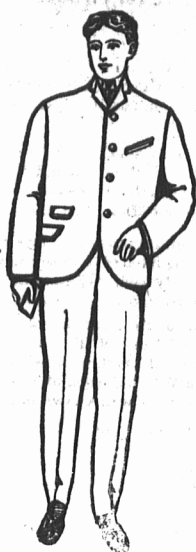
