Damages Case Against Acadia To Begin Nov. 1

(By The Canadian Press)
HALIFAX, Oct. 19—Hearing of an action by F. W. P. Brewster of Saint John, N.B., for \$7,255 damages against Acadia University of Wolfville, N.S., was scheduled for Nov. 1 by Mr. Justice John Doull as the Supreme Court's civil term opened here today.
Mr. Brewster also claims that he, his heirs and assigns are entitled forever to free tuition of one scholar at the University. He contends he is legal owner of a certificate of perpetual scholarship issued in 1876 by the University's

governors.
The University accepted two scholars appointed by him in 1920 and 1936 but from 1937 on refused to recognize his right, the claim stated.
