ROSEBERRY'S LONE FURROW.

Lord Rosebery's position in British, and one might almost say in European politics, stands almost alone in the records of great men past and present. When a man, no matter how prominent the position he has filled, or how big the space in the limelight he has occupied, definitely retires from the arena, his career is discussed with animation by men in the street and at the clubs, and then dropped. That means that the process of forgetting the man starts right away, and he simply is forgotten until the day comes along when in the natural order of things, the papers chronicle his death and relieve themselves each of one more stock biography from the journalistic cemetery. No so with his lordship of Epsom and Mentmore and Dalmeny—the uncrowned King of Scotland, as he used to be, and still is, called. The British public will not allow him to be forgotten so easily. And he is likely to get back those honours and periodically revised biographies for many years yet.

This deliberate and stubborn keeping alive of Lord Rosebery as a factor that counts in the political game is something really quite wonderful in Britain which so easily forgets its prominent men than perhaps any other nation. Mr. Gladstone was a remarkable man, and disciples and opponents alike admit that he was about the greatest public man of the Victorian era. That is not to be wondered at in itself, for Gladstone was a leading, if not the leading figure, on the world's stage for forty or fifty stirring years. But he never quite touched the people like his successor. Lord Rosebery is wealthy, he is an orator, he has won the Derby, and he has been Prime Minister during an eventful six months. With other outstanding central facts does or can the average man associate the name of Earl of Rosebery. And yet he is still the unknown force, the man who might if he would, the mysterious entity to whom men of widely divergent opinions turn whenever there is a crisis, a gathering or a storm brewing in British domestic or foreign politics.

ing, carpentering, and tinsmithings, soap making, shoe making and blacksmithing are also to be attempted when the right man who combines the ability to develop character of the students as well as teach a trade is found for the place. Another Mission in Rangoon, Burma, asks for a man to be superintendent of a mission press employing 200 hands. This is one of the best and most complete printing and publishing plants in the East and up to date in every particular. Another man is needed in Mexico who can direct a mission press and look after the financial affairs of the station. For a position in West China, a man is needed who will be superintendent of construction work; in Hawaii a boarding school needs an instructor in carpentry who knows as well how to do all sorts of things, handle farm machinery, build roads and make furniture; an industrial leader is needed when the central man who combines supervisory capacities. Over 4,800 student volunteers have found their way to the foreign mission fields largely through the college Association movement in the past ten years, but most of them as preachers and medical missionaries. In this kind of field there are opportunities for qualified men who want to serve men in foreign lands who are not preachers.

Y. M. C. A. BRIEFS.

There was a unique dedication of a Y. M. C. A. building in McPherson, Kansas, recently. On Sunday night at a big mass meeting Hon. M. B. Williams, member of the Kansas legislature made an appeal for the \$2,800 needed to dedicate their building without debt, and over \$3,000 was pledged. Then almost at midnight the great meeting adjourned and marched in a body to the Association building to dedicate it without debt to a service to young men. This Association is unique in another particular. It has an endowment of a \$12,000 wheat farm.

In Canton the Y. M. C. A. has gotten possession of one of the most striking situations for its building on the "Bund" the broad and popular boulevard along the river front. Back of its building is a garden with tea houses where during the hottest months of the year 500 to 1,000 young men assemble of an evening. At a series of lectures on sanitation, tuberculosis, agriculture, national welfare and different branches of science, 6,496 men attended in one month.

LORD ROSEBERRY AS AMATEUR ACTOR.

Not long after Earl Rosebery succeeded to the title he took the part of Dougal in an amateur performance of "Rob Roy" at Dunfermline, says a writer in The Tatler. His Lordship had to don a tattered wig of fiery red. In the well-known rough-and-tumble scene of the play he managed to let this drop from his head, and the incident evoked much laughter among the audience. Dougal grinned too, but when he picked up his wig and placed it on the wrong way the house simply roared. Sitting next to the person who told the story were a dour old pair—a farmer and his wife. The lady's criticism was very severe. "That Dougal's a gawk," she said "Wha-ever he is he's done his best to turn a gran' play like 'Rob Roy' into a pantomime!"
