Britisher Praises Canadian Cattle

TORONTO, May 2.—A tribute to Canadian commercial cattle, that is the more impressive because of appearing in a paper which is none too friendly to Canadian interests, is paid by a correspondent of The Scottish Farmer (Glasgow), in the latest issue of that journal to reach this country. In comment upon the number of unthrifty, weedy native cattle of Great Britain, R.H. Green, Willesborough, Kent, remarks:

"I wonder what the Canadians must think about it. They have bought our pedigree bulls to grade up their cattle, and now we try, by Government interference, to prevent them sending us better stock than our own, speaking generally. It is also reported that bulls which have not been considered good enough for service in Ireland have been sent across the Irish Channel for service here. Both North and South American breeders are also astonished to see such miserable specimens of cattle throughout this country, which must have an unfavorable effect."

There were 94 cattle, 382 calves, 499 hogs and 30 sheep and lambs for sale on the two markets in addition to eight cars of small stock to arrive before noon. Trading was confined mostly to calves and hogs. The calves ranged from \$5.00 to \$7.00 with the bulk from \$6.00 to \$6.50 and hogs \$14.75 to \$15.00 with a few sales at \$14.40. A few cows of cutter quality sold for \$3.00 to \$3.50 and some better ones brought \$4.00 to \$4.50.
