C. B. FOSTER, C. P. R. district passenger agent at Toronto, who left here last evening on his return west, said the travel westward in the course of a few weeks will be very heavy. The usual rush to the wheat field will create a decided increase of business, also the travel to the Toronto exhibition. The first harvesters' excursion from here will be Aug. 19.—St. John Telegraph.

JAMES MCKENNA, C. P. R. travelling passenger agent, returned last evening from a trip up the North Shore. Mr. McKenna says that the rush to the west this month will be greater than ever. He had hundreds of enquiries, and it seems as though half the people in the country have made up their minds to go west. Last year the maritime provinces sent thirty-two hundred on the farm laborers' excursions, and this year Mr. McKenna thinks the total will reach five thousand, if that many will be required from this district. There will be no such confusion as existed last year in the way of lack of accommodation, for this season St. John will have the first excursion. The crowds will start from here earlier and reach the west ahead of other excursions from Upper Canadian points. There will thus be plenty of cars available, and when the excursionists reach the west they will meet with any delay in securing work.—St. John Sun.

ABOUT one o'clock last Tuesday afternoon, fire broke out in the residence of John McLeod, Victoria Cross. Mr. McLeod, who resides alone was absent at the time, helping his brother with his hay-making and the fire was well under way when some school children, who happened to be in the yard for water discovered the flames and gave the alarm. Neighbors were soon on the spot and by great exertions saved the building, though badly gutted. The furniture and movables were removed with but little damage, and had it not been for the noble efforts of the crowd, the building would have been completely destroyed. The well on the premises and one on the next neighbor's were dried before the fire was put out. As a fire was left in the cooking stove it is supposed that some defect in the chimney was the cause of the burning. It is understood that the loss is partly covered by insurance.
