WANT PROHIBITION DOMINION ISSUE.

MONTREAL, July 2.—The National Grand Lodge of the Order of Good Templars has passed a resolution in favor of the granting of the franchise to women, "believing that the enfranchisement of women would greatly aid the cause of prohibition." The National Grand Lodge also endorsed a plan to form a prohibition party in every constituency, and authorized John H. Roberts, Montreal, National electoral superintendent, to take action to organize the voting strength of prohibitionists throughout the Dominion.
