Synopsis of Canadian Northwest Land Regulations

THE sole holder of a homestead or any state over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Application must be made in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency, but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions.
