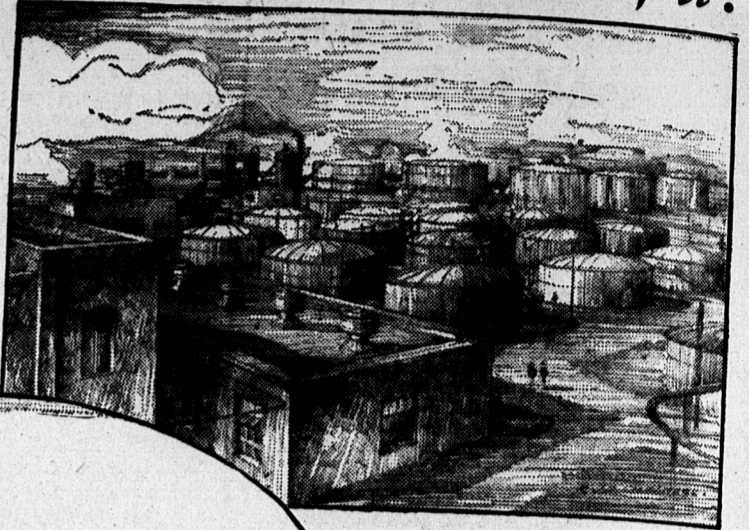

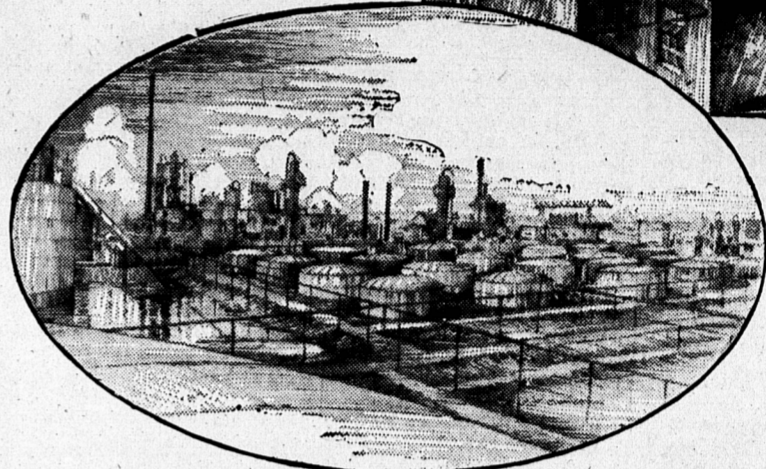

—SNOW WHITE GEESE VISIT ST. LAWRENCE TWICE EVERY YEAR

QUEBEC, Que., May 23.—(By the Canadian Press)—One of the prettiest sights to be seen on a summer's day in this district is the flock of some ten thousand Greater Snow Geese which annually have formed the habit of making their home for a brief period in the spring and early autumn, in a 3-mile bay below Capt Tourmente, about three miles from the village of St. Joachim, Quebec.

The best time to see them is in the afternoon, owing to the position of the sun, when the bay with its surface and scattered sand bars swarming with the birds looks almost like an Alabama cotton field in full bloom from an airplane.

"As far as we know," said Mr. Meredith, an authority on bird lore and an enthusiastic duck hunter who has visited the bay for many years, "the flock now numbers close on to 10,000 its numbers having increased since spring hunting has been prohibited, and a protection patrol has been established by the Provincial Government.

"The birds, which are unique on the American continent, have their breeding grounds on the West coast of Greenland. They winter on the ocean off the Carolinas; come to Cape Tourmente towards the end of March; leave about the fifteenth of May; come back again in the Fall flying to note that since the flock

about the beginning of September, and leave for their winter quarters towards the middle of November.

"I spoke to an old chap who has lived in the neighborhood of the bay, and who is an octogenarian, and he told me that the birds, a few at first and increasing in numbers each year, have been coming there for at least fifty or sixty years.

"Why they come, or how they come to choose this particular bay along the St. Lawrence has never been discovered, but we do know that they feed on certain grass herbs which grow in profusion there and which the birds uproot with their bills.

"Another puzzle is what becomes of the young? The flock does not seem more mature from one year to the another, and I along with others who have formed the opinion that they must be harassed by foxes etc., on their breeding grounds. It is gratifying to note that since the flock

has been given protection it is increasing in numbers."
