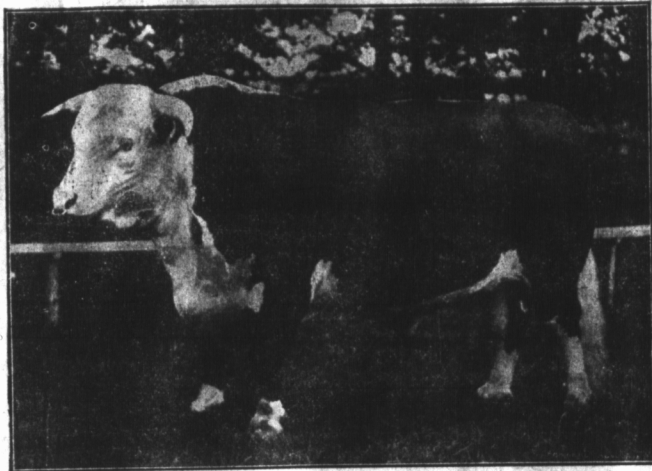

**N'FLD. FISHERMEN
AND AMERICANS**

St. John's, N. B., Oct. 9.—The state-
ments contained in a Washington de-
spatch received here today to the
effect that Newfoundland merchant
fishermen controlled the government
and tried to prevent the Americans se-
curing treaty rights and had hampered
the British government in assuring
such rights to Americans, is indignantly
denied in official circles. On the con-

trary, officials declare that the British
government strongly upheld every con-
tention advanced by Newfoundland until
a few weeks ago, when it suddenly aban-
doned the colony and surrendered to the
Americans. In support of this the offi-
cials cite Congressman Gardner's letter
to the Gloucester Board of Trade, of July
7, 1906, wherein Mr. Gardner, speaking as
the mouthpiece of the state department,
said:
"The state department believes that
Newfoundland has the right to pro-
hibit its own citizens from engaging in
our crews unless they are inhabitants
of the United States. Our rights to se-
cure such crews by advertisement in
Newfoundland papers would undoubt-
edly be contested by Great Britain."
