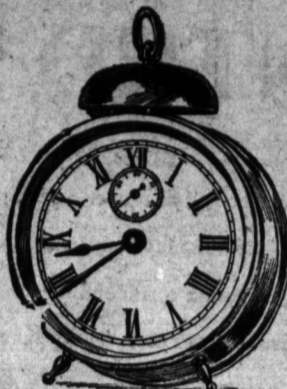

There were only 21 executions issued for the collection of Poll Tax and this quite easily holds the record for the smallest number of executions for Poll Tax issued in any one year. Last year the Poll Tax was increased from \$2.10 to \$2.25. I presume that another slight increase would do away with the need of issuing executions. The receipts of the Court for the past year have been \$87.61, a slight increase over the past year before. Through the agency of the Court \$30.00 in taxes was collected and paid into the City."

At first the old man was careless as to whether he should be reprieved or not, but latterly is reported to have shown great eagerness to live, and has been eagerly looking forward to news of the commutation of his sentence.
