Husband Shortage

Theme Of Article By Noted Writer

A striking article on "The Husband Shortage" appears in the current issue of Coopers' from the pen of Mr. Amram Scheinfeld, New York, brother of Mrs. Leo Frank, of Rosebank, this Province.

Mr. Scheinfeld writes, "We always had more than enough men to work the surplus of women as well for young widows and divorcees. The biological factors noted had not yet worked to create an excess of females, and more important, we were still able to draw upon the heavy surplus of foreign-born males brought in by previous immigration. Now the situation for American girls is something like playing 'Going to Jerusalem,' using men instead of chairs. With each turn of the years, additional men have been yanked away and more girls have been left behind.

"We now have almost exactly 100 males to every 100 females, 102.5 males to 100 females. But the figures are deceptive. First, they count as present all the men who went overseas, and do not take into consideration the war casualties. Again, the figures include the half million surplus of males under 21 which is destined to be wiped out with maturity. Last, but far from least, the figures include a relatively huge male surplus of 600,000 in the foreign-born groups, mostly over fifty, and few of them marriage prospects. Subtracting these, by 1940 our white population in the States is about 100 million, with a surplus of 10 million females.

"This is a situation, Mr. Scheinfeld warns, "which has disrupted the social and moral codes of other countries. In America unless a better answer is found than anyone has found so far."
