The Markets At A Glance

WINNIPEG, Feb. 20 (CP)—Mar and July futures continued their advance on the Winnipeg Grain Exchange today and touched new highs with May closing at \$2.72 bid and July going its five-cent limit to close at \$2.94 1/2 bid. October was down at \$1.93 bid.

CHICAGO, Feb. 20 (AP)—Another sharp advance in Rye and Wheat imported some strength to the May delivery of the grain here more of the time today, while both above and below yesterday's close.

NEW YORK, Feb. 20 (AP)—The third successive day of tumbling prices ended one to 7 points off leading stocks in today's market.

While the pace of the decline slowed appreciably from Tuesday's precipitous drop, the downturn has wiped out nearly 35 per cent of the average gain made by stocks in the climb to 15-year peak since the Japanese surrender last August.

Steel, rails, motors, rubbers, and a number of "blue chip" issues were subject to selling pressure from the opening.

Customers were described in some quarters as concerned over the Government's newest war price policy and the possible effects of its adjustments on individual companies.

MONTREAL, Feb. 20 (CP)—Losses had an advantage over gains of 3 to 1 in trading today on the stock exchange and curbed the downward trends of Tuesday in sympathy with New York where turnover was comparatively small. Only bright spot in the list boarded occurred among a group of preferred issues. Steico, Tar, International Bronze, Simpson and Neon pushed up 1/2 (CP).

TORONTO, Feb. 20 (CP)—The downward movement in the stock market continued through today's session although there was considerable rally in last hour, cutting losses over the board. The close found the gold stocks down 1/2 to 1.08. Western oils netted a drop of only 1/8.

Featuring the trade was the action of Joliet and Buffalo Red Lake. Joliet advanced from a morning low of 1.25 to a top of 1.32 and while trading in volume of 335,500 shares. Buffalo Red Lake topped from yesterday's close of 83 cents to 40 cents and closed at 45 for a net loss of 38 cents.
