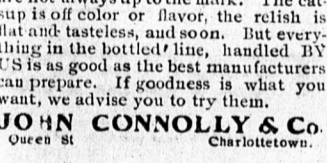

SOLID SILVER FURNITURE.

Extraordinary Order of An Indian Prince—The Highest Art of Sheffield—Cost Runs Into High Figures.

There is now being made in England for an Indian prince a suite of bedroom furniture such as it would not have seemed possible, according to the Sheffield Daily Telegraph, to conceive of outside the pages of the "Arabian Nights." To begin with, the suite is of silver—not a silver mounted or silver plated affair, but for the most part solid sterling silver furniture, upon which the highest art of Sheffield is being lavished.

The bedstead, not yet complete, will be a wonderful work of art. Everything about it will soothingly suggest sleep. The copies of the sleep pictures of famous British artists, which have been reproduced in silver for the panels of the bedstead, and the beautiful solid silver angels at the corners are magnificent examples of art in silver.

Thousands of ounces of silver have been employed, and the cost must run into figures which astonish as well as indicate the opulence and extravagance of the prince who could give such an order.

The general design of the furniture is that of Louis XVI. or early Georgian, in strictest conformity with the orders to follow Eastern effects and to decorate everything floridly.

The suite comprises a four-post bedstead, twelve couches, four tables, drawing room cabinet and lady's dressing table. The bedstead, 8 feet long by 6 feet broad and 13 feet 6 inches high, is most magnificent, both in design and execution.

The head panel, in allovering repose, is an allegorical representation of sleep, after Albert Moore, R.A. On the foot panel "Dancing Nymphs," after the same artist, are exquisitely depicted by the firm's most capable chaser, Mr. J. A. Brooks.

Surmounting the pedestal are figures representing the four seasons, standing three feet high, which have been specially modelled by the well known Edinburgh Academician, Mr. Birnie Rhind. All are charming and refined in treatment, but the figures of Spring and Winter are uniquely attractive in their cultured symbolism.

The decoration of frieze or valance which surrounds the bed is a series of arabesques, and the architraves of canopy which spring from four graceful, elegantly proportioned fluted columns terminate in the crown, cushion and other royal insignia, modelled and carved actual size.

The drawing room cabinet and dressing table are in the style of Chippendale or French marqueterie. The panels are flower studies in repose, chasing with the wild rose, the blackberry, etc.; but the execution is so refined and delicate that the otherwise solid and heavy appearance of metal work is entirely subordinated, indeed, the graceful and symmetrical balance of each piece are the first merit that strikes one.

A conspicuous feature of these large items is the sharply defined mouldings, ogees, solid entablature and paneling, which fulfil the scheme of construction.

The dining room and easy chairs, also the two couches, or ottomans, are in the best taste and artistic fitness in relation to the measures of the parts. They look exceedingly handsome and graceful. To obtain the correct contour and rigidity necessary for actual use, light frames of oak have been made, upon which sterling silver has been solidly fitted, soldered, cast and decorated.

The four console tables are entirely of sterling silver, designed for occasional use in honour of drawing room, and otherwise for supporting decorative statuary or race plate. All four are of different shape, but with the same proportionate arrangement, distribution and general effect. The decoration is Louis Seize silver chasing in low relief, and all mountings and cast fillets, while massive and substantial, are so harmoniously assembled and toned down by faithful workmanship that nothing is strident, nothing bizarre.
