THE Halifax Herald of Dec. 11th says: The annual meeting of the school for the blind took place last evening, and the assembly hall of the building was filled by an assemblage of ladies and gentlemen. His Honor Governor Jones in the chair. The report of the managers was presented by George Mitchell, M. P. P., and of the superintendent by himself, C. F. Frazer, who by the way is one of the most up-to-date educationists of the blind to be found anywhere, and who has made his school known throughout the world. The superintendent's report was an exhaustive review of the work of the school and matters connected with the institution present and prospective. It was in part as follows: "During the year 132 blind persons have been under instruction, 79 of whom were males 53 females. Of these 15 have since graduated, or remained at home making the total number registered December 1st, 1900, 117, of whom 69 are males and 48 females. Of these 63 are from the province of Nova Scotia, 34 from New Brunswick, and 6 from P. E. Island, 8 from Newfoundland, and one from British Guinea
