CANADIAN PACIFIC IS NOT GOING INTO THE COMBINATION

Mr. Campbell Declares There Will be no Change in Policy—Views of Mr. Hannah.

(Montreal Herald)

"Any fear that may be entertained of the Canadian Pacific's new steamer line entering either the continental steamship combine or the Morgan trust is groundless" said Mr. D. W. Campbell, this morning, when shown a London cable. "I have no reason to believe that the old policy of the Beaver line will be changed. Up to the time of its absorption into the C. P. R., Company its business was carried on along independent lines. Its traffic arrangements were not influenced in any way by the traffic arrangements that governed the business of the big steamship pools.

"It is altogether probable that it will continue to be an independent line, at least for some time to come. I fail to see where the recent stoppage of continental emigration to Canada comes in. Neither the Beaver line nor, so far as I know, the Allan Line have gone out of the continental passenger business. Both are merely taking advantage of the present abnormally high tide of British immigration to Canada. It is always more profitable to book business from England than from the continent and naturally it is given the preference. But we have not by any means gone out of the continental business. The difference between the continental business and the British business is that the former is a steady stream of traffic while the latter is made up of intermittent bursts of activity. We get as much business from England just now as we can carry, and also for some time to come.

"I fail altogether to see where the triumph of the continental steamship combine comes in.

SAYS IMPRESSION IS WRONG.

"If there is any impression that we have been driven out of the continental business it is entirely wrong. At the proper time we will again turn our attention to the continent. In any case we are still in it until May 1 and as for the theory that the Beaver line will enter either the Continental or the Morgan steamship pool let me repeat that it is altogether unlikely.

"If you have twelve parties carrying on a similar business and eleven of them bound by an ironbound agreement it stands to reason that the twelfth party who is acting independently has a distinct advantage. That is the position of the Beaver line in the continental business.

NOT HAMPERED BY AGREEMENT.

"It works unhampered by the agreement binding the other lines and it as your cable states the continental combine has determined to send up the rates you will see that it will only increase the present advantage of the C. P. R.'s new line.

MR. GEORGE A. HANNAH'S VIEWS.

Mr. George Hannah, passenger manager of the Allan line here, displayed considerably more interest in the cable when he was shown it, than Mr. Campbell.

"It opens up a vast field of speculation and possibilities" he said, after reading it carefully "and more extensive information will be of more than passing interest.

"Your correspondent evidently assumes that the Canadian lines have retired from the continental field, leaving it open, without opposition to the continental combine.

"If that were so it would be a triumph for the continental combine in so far as they would be at liberty to do what they pleased in the matter of rates. But the Beaver line is still a factor in the business and will be until May 1, at least."

"As to the possibility of the Canadian Pacific becoming a member of either or both of the continental and Morgan combines, it will easily be seen, when the situation is looked at in its broadest aspect, that it is not only a possibility but a probability. The interests of the C. P. R. cover a much wider field than the interests of the Beaver line under its old management. The problem which confronts the C. P. R. since it entered the

SIGNIFICANCE OF THE SCHEME.

"If the C. P. R. decides to enter the lists as a competitor to the continental combine, it is only natural to expect that the steamship companies running to American ports will retaliate by discriminating against the C. P. R. transcontinental traffic. At present the C. P. R. has an agreement with the American lines which puts it upon an equal basis with transcontinental lines in the States. If the American lines found it necessary to retaliate and discriminate in their bookings, it is possible that the C. P. R. may lose such valuable railway business.

"Whatever the policy of C. P. R. will be in its new venture, it is certain that it will be vastly different to the policy that directed the old Beaver line.

"There is another feature of the present situation that might be noted. The fact that the Canadian lines are directing the most of their attention to British immigration to Canada is a good thing for the country. It simply means that they are giving a good class of settlers a preference over a poor class. A large proportion of the immigration to Canada from Southern Europe especially has been found unsatisfactory, as shown by the fact that Canada and inspectors reject a large percentage of these emigrants on landing, and the companies are forced to take them back."
