Man Found Dead, Companion Very Ill, In Boarding House

William Stewart, 50 Prince Street, City, was found dead, and Stephen J. Duffy, 1 Stewart Street, was found to be seriously ill, when City Police investigated a call from a boarding house, formerly known as the Peardon House at 225 Water Street on Saturday afternoon.

On investigating the call, Constable Butler of the City police force found one man lying on the floor and another on a bed in a bedroom of the house. An empty 12-ounce bottle of rubbing alcohol was in the room. He immediately called in a doctor, who, on examination, pronounced that the man on the floor, Mr. Stewart, was dead. The other man, Duffy, was found to be in a serious condition, and was immediately taken to the Charlottetown Hospital. It was later reported that his condition was improving.

Bed-Ridden P.E.I. Veteran Is Confirmed

HALIFAX, Feb. 28 - With the bed from which he cannot move because of his crippled condition wheeled into the chapel of Camp Hill Hospital Thursday afternoon blind Thomas Yeo of Harmony, P.E.I. was confirmed by Most Rev. G. F. Kingston, Archbishop of Nova Scotia and Primate of all Canada.

SCIENCE AT OLYMPICS

LONDON - (CP) - In the high jump events at the Olympic games to be held in Britain in 1948, invisible rays passing between the posts and picked up by selenium cells, will record the exact height of the jump achieved. All other events - including long jumps, track events and fencing - will also be recorded electrically.

77,000 DPs IN BRITAIN

LONDON - (CP) - More than 77,000 of the world's displaced persons have found a home in Britain - the largest group to settle in any country. Twenty-eight thousand men are working in agriculture, coal mining and iron and steel industries, and 8,000 women have been placed in textile mills, hospitals and hostels.
