



RECOVERING OF MISSING BODIES.

LONDON, May 11.—American Ambassador Page has received a message from United States Consul Frost at Queenstown urging him to make clear to the Canadian Company and to the British Admiralty that "really effective measures to recover the 1,100 missing bodies from the Lusitania are imperative."

In this connection Mr Page said today that the embassy was doing everything possible to expedite the recovery of the bodies, and that he had assurances from the Admiralty and the company that they were doing and would continue to do, the same.

To our Fellow Boarders of the 55th Battalion Overseas Service, Soldiers and Gentlemen.—On hearing of your departure from among us at an early date, and wishing to make known to you in some manner our appreciation of your gentlemanly conduct and cheerful disposition, we take this opportunity of wishing you God-speed, and hoping the dangerous undertaking on which you are starting may be successful and creditable to the Island and the Empire.

Please accept this small gift as a token of the respect in which we hold you.

Accompanying this was a box of very fine cigars for each boarder who was departing. Mr Ernest Gaudet and

Mr Sullivan, two of the gallant boys, made neat and suitable replies of gratitude and appreciation. Mr Bolger presided and made the presentation most satisfactorily. Miss Annie Berrigan, daughter of the proprietor of the King George, Mr Michael Berrigan, then presented each soldier with a nice substantial luncheon to carry with them on their journey to the next training camp. This was also highly pleasing and much appreciated by the boys. Mr Ernest Wood also appropriately addressed the young men before their departure.




