Clothing Regulation Effective At Once

MONTREAL, March 24—(CP)—The War-time Prices and Trade Board today issued an amendment to its order of March 5 restricting the use of cloth in the manufacture of men's clothing which will result in restrictions going into effect at midnight tonight.

The authorized suit will consist of a single-breasted jacket, trousers without cuffs, and several other restrictions designed to save cloth.

FREDERICTON, March 24—(CP)—A resolution petitioning the Dominion Government to have the present price ceiling on potatoes removed for the balance of the 1941 crop was passed unanimously by the New Brunswick Legislature tonight.

NEW YORK, March 24—(AP)—The mystery of the missing Canadian motorship tanker Canadotte was partly cleared up today with a report from German-occupied Copenhagen that the 11,309-ton vessel had been captured by a German warship and taken into Bordeaux, France.

Gov't Launches Huge Selective Service Scheme

OTTAWA, March 24—(CP)—The Government today launched an extended national selective service plan designed to obtain from every Canadian the utmost contribution to the war effort through application of "the negative compulsion of restriction."

Increased to 30 years age limit for compulsory service in Canada; Aimed also at conserving Farm labor.

Prime Minister Mackenzie King outlined in the House of Commons new regulations restricting employment in non-essential civilian occupations, increasing to 30 years the age limit for compulsory service in Canada, and conserving the available farm labor.

600,000 Nazi Reserves hurled Into battle

MOSCOW, March 24—(AP)—The Germans have hurled 600,000 reserves into a massive but futile effort to wrest the initiative from the Red Army, the Russians reported tonight, and a special announcement said 16,000 of the enemy had been killed on the Leningrad front alone.
