

PTE. DUNCAN CURRIE DIED OF WOUNDS
 Enlisted in 138th Batt. and Was Afterwards Transferred to 49th.
 Edmonton Bulletin, Nov. 22.)

Word was received on Wednesday by Mrs. R. W. R. Armstrong, 322 Armstrong Block, 104th Street, of the death from wounds on Oct. 28th, of her nephew Pte. Duncan E. Currie. The deceased soldier was born at Alberton, P. E. I., where his mother died some years ago, and where his father, Hector Currie, now resides. He graduated from the high school, Kamloops, B.C., making the highest marks in literature ever made in the history of the school, and passed his entrance examinations to McGill University. He also attended the Normal School at Camrose, Alberta.

land and enlisted in the 138th battalion under Lt. Col. Belcher, and later accompanied the battalion to England. Although anxious to get to the front he was kept in England until after his nineteenth birthday, when he was transferred to the 49th battalion in France. He was with Edmonton's own battalion during many of the famous battles in which it was engaged. Fessenden he was buried and received shell shock, but after a few weeks in a hospital in France he again returned to the firing line. He was a crack rifle shot, having made the fourth highest score among three thousand men with whom he took target practice in England, and did duty as a sniper for some time in France. He was selected by Capt. Percy Hardisty as his "runner" while that officer was with the 49th. Some months ago Pte. Currie was promoted to the intelligence branch, 7th Brigade Headquarters. A few weeks ago he was recommended for a commission in the R. C. R., and had been granted a furlough to commence on Nov. 1st. He was only a few feet from Capt. Percy Belcher at the time that gallant officer received the wounds that caused his death, and assisted in placing the body in the temporary shelter of a shell hole.

Pte. Currie had a cheerful sunny disposition which endeared him to all of his comrades, and many of the returned members of the 138th and 49th battalions with regret to learn that he was called on to make the supreme sacrifice of his young life a few short days before the close of the struggle for the liberty and peace of the world. Besides his aunt, Mrs. Armstrong with whom he made his home while in Edmonton, Pte. Currie leaves a brother in the city, Kenneth B. Currie, formerly of Motor Sales, Limited. A younger brother, Allen is in Daysland, where are also the deceased's grandmother, Mrs. B. C. Matthews, sr., and his aunt, Mrs. W. W. MacGregor, and two uncles, H. B. Matthews and E. C. Matthews. Another uncle, Allen F. Matthews, M. A., is inspector of schools, Kamloops, B. C., but was formerly in Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown. An aunt, Mrs. John Wells, resides at Hill's River.
