Portfolio Bill Passed By House

Opposition Amendments Defeated In Legislature Yesterday. Provincial Legislature, March 14 The House met at 4 p. m. Hon. Mr. Stewart tabled replies to some questions on the order paper.

Mr. B. W. LePage moved the Clause 1, which provides for the appointment of a Minister of Health and Education, at a yearly salary of \$2,000, be struck out and in lieu thereof the following inserted: "That in accordance with the recommendation of the Education Commission and owing to the present depressed condition of the Provincial finances, the office or portfolio of Minister of Health and Education shall be held by the Premier and Attorney General, or Minister of Agriculture until otherwise enacted."

Cities Falconwood Report Hon. Mr. Sharp regretted that there appeared to be a disposition on the part of the Opposition to oppose the appointment, which they themselves had created. Yet efficiency requires a full time head of this important department. Mr. Sharp cited from the report of Doctors Flemming and Mitchell of McGill University on the condition of Falconwood Hospital prior to the fire. He read: "The main building is old and in urgent need of repair and remodeling. The whole plumbing system is antiquated, and the toilet-rooms off the wards are equipped with unsuitable and out-of-date fixtures."

men's Association, now in session in their Hall, known as the Montgomery Hall, their Tenth day of March, 1932, taking into consideration the present economic situation of our Town, as well as our province and the world at large, and further considering that the produce of the farm as well as other commodities of living has declined to a very low level, making the purchasing power very much greater than it was a few years ago.

Further resolved, that we the Workmen's Association, petition the Town Council, of the Town of Summerside, to have our fee for labor performed, reduced from the present rate of 30 cents (thirty cents) per hour to the sum of 25c. (twenty-five cents) per hour, same to take effect at once.

This resolution was passed by the council and the clerk instructed to reduce the rate accordingly. A resolution was passed that legislation be prepared and presented to the Legislative Assembly giving the Council power to make such by-laws for the regulation and control of the town's restaurants, etc., where soft drinks and kind are disposed, and also to provide for the hours in which said places shall do business and to provide for the closing or otherwise regulating of such on Sunday.

A letter was read from the various butchers of the town, asking that a heavier tax be put upon meat vendors coming in to the town as they considered that the present tax of \$3.00 made the resident butchers up against an unfair competition as they had heavy overhead expenditures. After some discussion the letter was laid over until the next meeting. A resolution was passed to meet the school board and a delegation from the Board of Trade to discuss the question of adding two more grades to the present high school. Meeting to be at 7.30 to-night. Judge J. E. Wyatt, K. C., was reappointed as recorder for the town at the same salary as before and also his salary as Stipendiary Magistrate to be the same as before.
