**THE ASSASIN
IS AN ITALIAN**
LONDON, June 1.—A despatch from
Madrid to the Daily Mail, dated 2.25
Thursday evening, says that it was an
Italian anarchist who threw the bomb at
the carriage of the King and Queen of
Spain, and that after the explosion he
committed suicide. Another despatch
to the same paper dated 9.25 p. m., says
that the assassin is named Mateo Moral,
and that he escaped.
The place from which the bomb was
thrown is a boarding house. The cham-
ber from which the missile was hurled
was taken May 23, by a man from
Barcelona, giving the name of Mora.
When the police surrounded the house
the man attempted to flee, but was
captured. Another man escaped over the
roofs of houses.

**THE VIRGINIAN
BREAKS RECORD**
MONTREAL, June 1.—The Allan line
steamship Virginia has again broken the
ocean record between Moville and
Rimouski, making the fastest passage in
the history of the St. Lawrence.
The Virginia arrived at Rimouski at
1.15 a. m. yesterday, and after landing
her mails and passengers, proceeded to
Quebec at 9 a. m. The time of the pas-
sage from Moville, after adding five hours
difference in time, is five days, twenty-
two hours and forty minutes. This is
eight hours faster than the best previous
record passage between these two points
made by the same steamer on June 1905,
and by the Victorian in May 1906.

SYDNEY, June 1.—News has been
received here that the Ried Newfoundland
steamer Glencoe struck a rock while
entering Kamee, near Burgeo, on the west
coast of Newfoundland, yesterday, and
had her bows so badly broken and made
water rapidly that she had to be beached
to save her from sinking. She had a
number of passengers on board. Temporary
repairs will probably be made to
enable the steamer to proceed to St.
John's, where she will go into dry dock.

**LABRADOR DOGS
KILLED DRIVER**
HALIFAX, June 1.—William McKay,
formerly of S. M. Brookfield's office,
Halifax, now assistant manager of the
Grand River Pulp and Lumber company
at Gillisport, Labrador, is home on a
short visit.
Mr. McKay says that on his way here,
while at Indian Harbor, three miles from
Battle Harbor, not far from Straits of
Belle Isle, he heard of a tragedy which
had occurred just previous to his arrival
when a man named Robert Crumby had
been killed and eaten by the dogs he was
driving. Crumby lives in a region
several miles from fire wood, and he was
on his way for a load, with a sledge
drawn by nine dogs. When out of sight
of the village and about twenty minutes
in advance of another dog team that was
following his dogs turned on him, and
tore him to pieces. When the following
team came up Crumby was dead and the
pack were devouring him. So intent and
ferocious were the canines, Mr. McKay
says, that two of them, before they
would cease tearing at the human flesh,
had their heads stricken with axes.

**LONDON HAS 1,000
AUTOMOBILE BUSES**
LONDON, June 1.—The doom of the horse
omnibus in London has certainly been
sealed. There are a thousand auto-
mobile buses now running through the
streets at a pace that unakes the old horse-
drawn vehicle seem to go at a small
pace.
The latest form of horseless bus to be
introduced to the electric vehicle.
It has already been named the electro-
bus, and has among the features
which commend it an almost entire
absence of vibration and an absolute
freedom from smell.
The cost of the new electro-bus is
\$8,500, which is somewhat under that of
the petro bus. Accommodation is
provided for thirty-four passengers inside
and out.
