ATHENS, April 16 (Special)—In his political will, which has just been published, King George, after giving directions for the disposition of his belongings, urges his children to 'remain united. Addressing himself to the new King, Constantine, King George, says:—

'Love your dear little country. Serve her and your dear people and have confidence in them, and may your brothers follow the same example.'

The will urges King Constantine to be courageous and patient, 'for you are reigning over a southern people whose temper and irritability take fire rapidly and who at any moment may say and do things which it is probable will be forgotten the following day. It is preferable that the King should suffer, even morally, rather than his people and his country. The interests of the people of the country must always be placed before all other interests.'

In conclusion King George declares his love for Queen Olga and urges his son to love and protect her.

EUGENE, Ore., April 16 (Special)—A message from Florence, Oregon, at the mouth of the Siuslaw River, stated that the gasoline schooner Anvil had been wrecked there with a crew aboard. After the receipt of this brief word the wires to Florence went down and no details could be obtained. The Anvil was a vessel 115 feet long, running from Portland, to Bandon, and carried a crew of twelve men. She carried passengers as well as freight.

BOSTON, Mass., April 16 (Special)—Thirty-three vessels in distress, carrying several hundred persons, were aided last winter by the revenue cutters Woodbury, Androscoggin, Itasca, and Acushnet off the New England coast. In the four months ended April 1 these cutters covered more than seventeen thousand miles in cruising between Point Judith, R. I., and Calais, Maine. The Androscoggin also made a fifteen hundred mile fruitless trip into Southern waters in search for the schooner Future, abandoned off Charleston.

During the winter the Woodbury aided nine vessels carrying fifty-seven persons, and valued at \$215,000. The Androscoggin aided eight vessels. The Itasca was able to help three vessels, valued at \$509,000. One of these, the steamship City of Macon, was run down and almost sunk in Vineyard Sound by the steamship James

SOFIA, April 16 (Special)—The representatives of the Powers have handed to the Premier, Mr. Guechoff their reply to the last note of the allies regarding the proposals for mediation in the war with Turkey. Mr. Guechoff promised to confer with the representatives of the allies and obtain their views on the note. The reply of the Powers is as follows:—

'The Powers note with satisfaction the disposition of the allies in favor of peace and make reply in the following manner to the points raised by the allies' note. To the first point, Bulgaria's demand regarding the Turko-Bulgarian frontier, no objections are raised. On the second point the Powers state that the fate of the Aegean Islands having been reserved for the consideration of the Powers, the point can only be admitted subject to decisions arrived at regarding certain of the islands.

'On the third point the Powers inform the allies that they are ready to communicate to them at once, the north and northeastern frontier of Albania, and that the southeastern and south frontier will be communicated to them as soon as it is determined. On the fourth point the Powers state that the solution of all questions of a financial character having been reserved for a technical commission, in Paris, in which delegates of the belligerents shall take part, they do not see any reason for giving their views at present on the question of indemnity.'

NEW YORK, April 17 (Special)—With the serving of a subpoena on John D. Archbold it was learned that the State of Texas has begun a suit against Standard Oil interests to recover \$100,000,000 for alleged breach of the trust statutes of that state. The Attorney-General of Texas claims that the Standard Oil companies of New York, New Jersey, Kentucky, Ohio, and Indiana, are practically under one control. In short, it is set forth that the Standard Oil Trust still exists and operates the Magnolia Petroleum Company as its Texas branch.
